Complete this action plan and discuss it with your GP. It contains important information you may need to have ready, so you can act fast if you test positive for COVID.

Some people are at higher risk of getting very sick from COVID.¹ These people may be eligible for COVID antiviral medicines when they test positive.

When you're sick with COVID, the virus multiplies and spreads inside your body. COVID antiviral medicines can help stop the virus from multiplying, so your immune system has the chance to fight the disease more easily.²

Know

if you're at risk of getting very sick and are eligible for COVID antiviral medicines

Many people don't want to think about COVID anymore. But understanding if you have risk factors for severe COVID illness and having a plan if you get COVID may help prevent a major disruption to your life.

It's important to act fast as antiviral medicines have to be taken as soon as possible – within 5 days after noticing symptoms of a COVID infection.

	Don't wait for your symptoms to get worse!
	Test to check that you have COVID, using an at-home rapid antigen test (RAT).
	Contact your GP, or call Healthdirect on 1800 022 222, to discuss getting started on your treatment plan. Have this plan with your medical history ready to share with your GP.
